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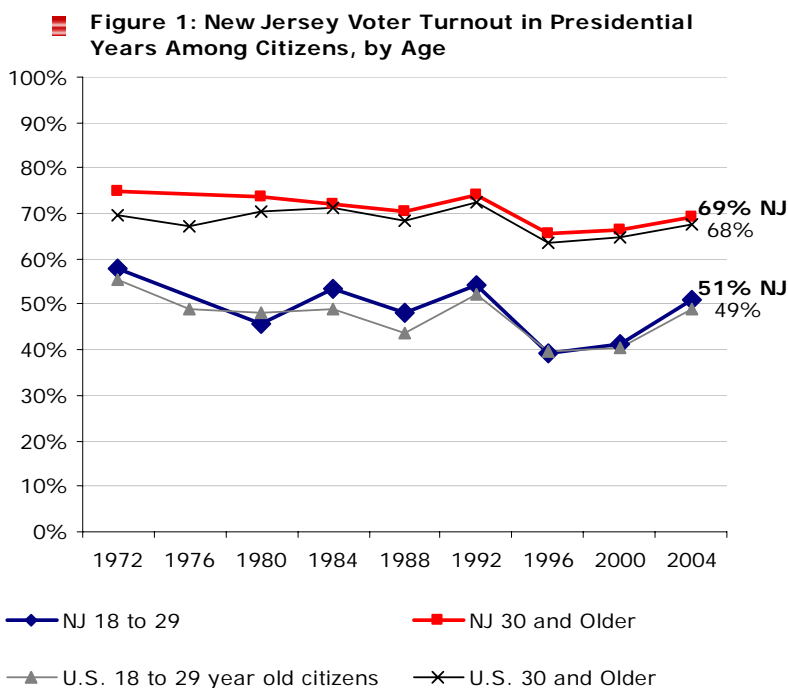
### Quick Facts About Young Voters in New Jersey: The Primary Election Year 2008

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New Jersey's young voters will be a key demographic on Super Tuesday—February 5<sup>th</sup>. This fact sheet presents information on young people's voter turnout rates (see Figure 1) and selected demographics (see Tables 1 and 2).
