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### Quick Facts About Young Voters in Oklahoma: The Primary Election Year 2008

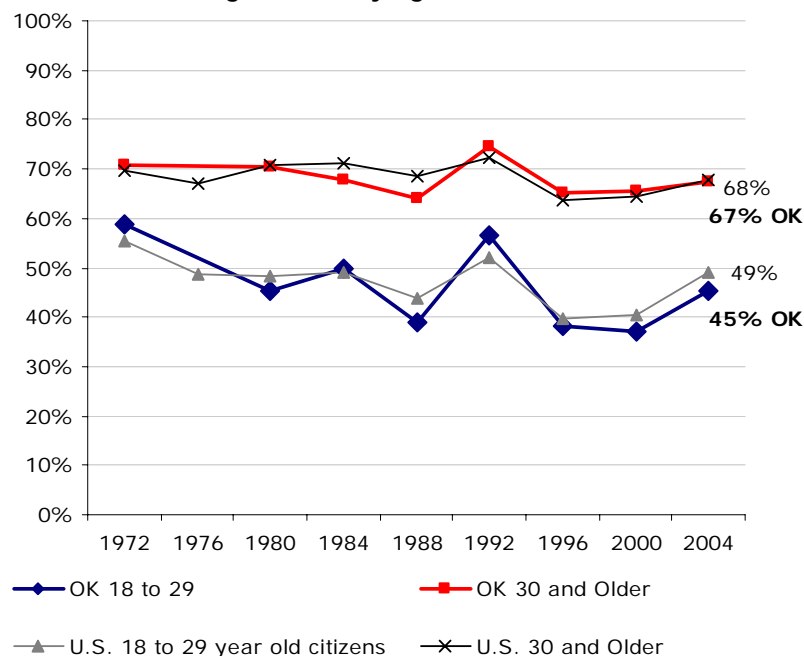
