

National Civic Engagement Survey I Spring 2002

Data Codebook

Introduction

This survey was fielded from April 4, 2002 to May 20, 2002. It was designed and conducted by Molly Andolina, DePaul University; Scott Keeter, George Mason University and the Pew Research Center; Cliff Zukin, Rutgers University; and Krista Jenkins, Rutgers University (project manager). It was funded by The Pew Charitable Trusts.

The dataset associated with the Survey contains responses from 3,246 respondents ages 15 and older on 266 variables. This survey was one of three that formed the basis for the report *The Civic and Political Health of the* Nation: A Generational Portrait, released September 19, 2002 by CIRCLE. The other two surveys that form the basis of this report are:

1. National Youth Survey of Civic Engagement, Spring 2002

Fielded: January 29 – February 25, 2002;

Sample Size: N=1,166; Population: Ages 15 to 25.

2. National Civic Engagement Survey II, Replication Survey, Fall 2002

November 14 – 20, 2002; Fielded:

Sample Size: N=1,400; Population: Age 18 and older.

Both surveys can be accessed on the CIRCLE web page, and are publicly available.

Methodology

This was a nationwide telephone survey with a total sample of N=3,246. Please note that 39 respondents refused to volunteer their age, but took the survey. Respondents who gave their age N=3,207.

Using these Data

The National Civic Engagement Survey I, Spring 2002 is available in four data formats: STATA version 8, SPSS Windows format, SPSS Portable format, and SAS Transport format. Analyses with these data can also be conducted using our online Survey Documentation Analysis software.

Any analysis of these data require the use of a weighting variable. Weight variables are:

- -Use "**step1wt**" when analyzing individual age groups.
- -Use "step2wt" when analyzing the total sample.

The sample is divided into four generations. The four generations referred to in the report and the data are:

- 1. DotNets, born after 1976 (N=1,001)
- 2. Generation Xers, born between 1964 and 1976 (N=1,000)
- 3. Baby Boomers, born between 1946 and 1964 (N=604)
- 4. Matures, born before 1946 (N=602)

The report associated with this dataset produces a typology of civic engagement. The typology and the variables used to create it are contained in the dataset and are explained in greater detail in the report, *The Civic and* Political Health of the Nation: A Generational Portrait.

Note that this study includes two different approaches to measuring group membership (questions GP1-GP9 and GPA-GPB). The method was changed part way through the study, but the two methods yield similar overall results. The SPSS syntax file creates a single set of measures for group membership and activity, but the questionnaire documents the two separate approaches.

A copy of the questionnaire associated with this survey is attached to the end of this codebook, and is available as a stand-alone document.
